

Mark Gertler: bio

Gertler is the Henry and Lucy Moses Professor of Economics at New York University and a Research Associate of the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER). He received his Ph.D. at Stanford University. He has published widely in macroeconomics, including nearly a dozen articles with Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke. The Institute for Scientific Information lists him as a “Highly-Cited Researcher in Economics.” Gertler also serves as an academic advisor for the Federal Reserve Bank of New York and as a Co-Director (with Pete Klenow) of the NBER’s program on Economic Fluctuations and Growth. He was formerly a Co-Editor of the *American Economic Review* and of the *NBER Macro Annual*. He also previously served as Chairman of the Economics Department and as Director of the C.V. Starr Center for Applied Research. Among professional honors, Gertler is a Fellow of the Econometric Society, a Guggenheim Fellow, and a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
